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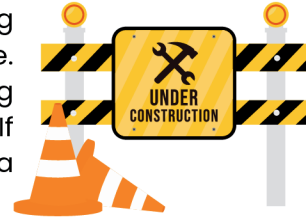

FROG CREEK ROAD – CULVERT REPLACEMENT

A twin culvert replacement project on Frog Creek Road will begin on August 4th, 2026, with the work anticipated to be approximately 3 weeks in duration. Frog Creek Road will be closed to through traffic during construction to ensure the safety of the construction crew, residents and motorists. Fire numbers 3–217 will be accessed via McIrvine Road. Fire numbers 235–945 will be accessed via Highway 611N. Motorists are urged to exercise caution and follow all posted signage to ensure everyone's safety. There will be increased noise and dust during working hours, and weather may impact the timeline. Thank you so much for your patience and understanding while this critical infrastructure update is completed. DID YOU KNOW?

Discarding fish guts in the ditch or on the roadside can be harmful to wildlife and unsafe for residents. Discarded fish guts can attract predators such as black bears, coyotes, and wolves. Providing wildlife with food can disrupt their natural instincts to hunt or forage. Once predators have found an easy food source, they can become reliant on humans to provide for them and may become aggressive when food isn't available. Not only are discarded fish guts harmful to wildlife, they can also spread disease, contaminate water and cause foul odours for surrounding neighbours.

Here are some ways to dispose of fish guts safely:

- Dispose at fish cleaning station or landfill immediately
- Freeze in a sealed bag until you can dispose of properly
- Bury 12" - 18" deep in your garden or flower bed to block the scent of decay from animals and neighbours



LEAVE NO TRACE

Use this list of emergency essentials to start building your emergency kit. Remember to inspect your kit and rotate supplies regularly to ensure they are ready when needed.

EMERGENCY ESSENTIALS

The following list includes essential items to have in your emergency kit:

- food (non-perishable and easy-to-prepare items, enough for three days) and a manual can opener
- bottled or bagged water (4 litres per person for each day) and backup water purification tablets
- medication(s)
- toilet paper and other personal items such as soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.
- personal protective equipment (PPE) such as medical masks and respirators
- back up chargers and power banks for cell phone or mobile device
- cash in small bills
- portable light source such as a flashlight, headlamp or glow stick
- radio (crank or battery-run)
- extra batteries
- first-aid kit
- candles and matches/lighter
- hand sanitizer or moist towelettes
- important papers such as a copy of your emergency plan, identification, contact lists, copies of prescriptions, etc.
- extra car and house keys
- whistle (to attract attention, if needed)
- zip-lock bag (to keep things dry)
- garbage bags and duct tape
